Writing		
Write opinion, informational, and narrative pieces with details and elaboration	Address the writing task of stating an opinion AND provide reasons that are supported with sufficient and relevant facts and details.	
	Write informative pieces with details and information related to the topic. Pieces include an introduction, organized paragraphs, and a concluding statement.	
	Write real or imagined experiences in a narrative with sensory details and a story structure that is clear.	
	Introduce the topic or text clearly.	
	Create an organizational structure in which related ideas are grouped to support the writer's purpose.	
	Link opinion and reasons using words and/or phrases.	
	Provide a concluding statement or section related to the opinion presented.	
Plan, revise, edit, and rewrite to strengthen writing	Generate and gather ideas about a topic.	
	Make a plan for how to write.	
	Draft different formats.	
	Improve writing by revising, editing, or rewriting.	
Research to gather information and present in an effective manner	Make adequate use of available resources.	
	Support an opinion with relevant and sufficient facts and details from resources with accuracy.

Reading Foundational Skills		
Know and apply grade level phonics and word analysis	Use combined knowledge of all letter-sound correspondences, syllabication patterns, and morphology (e.g., roots and affixes) to read accurately.	
Read with sufficient accuracy and fluency to support comprehension	Read primarily in larger, meaningful phrases or word groups; mostly smooth, expressive interpretation and pausing guided by author's meaning and punctuation; appropriate stress and rate with only a few slowdowns.	
Speaking and Listening		
Participate	Participate in different discussions (pairs, groups, whole class) with a variety of peers.	
effectively in a range of conversations	Add to others' ideas while contributing their own.	
	Prepare for discussions so that they can discuss topics and cite evidence.	
	Ask and answer questions to clarify or follow up on information presented.	
Present information, findings, and supporting evidence appropriate to task, purpose, and audience	Use direct eye contact with audience, but still return to notes consistently.	
	Speak with satisfactory variation of volume and inflection.	
	Be at ease with expected answers to all questions, without elaboration.	
	Present a clear purpose and subject; some examples, facts, and/or statistics that support the subject; include some data or evidence that supports conclusions.
