<u>Elementary Special Education and Section 504 Conference Call</u> -- Thank you to all of the parents and guardians who participated in our District's Special Education and Section 504 Conference Call last week with Superintendent of Schools, Tim Van Tasel, Assistant Superintendent, Michelle Zawawi, and Director of Pupil Services, Diana Kelley. We hope you found the information shared helpful, and we want you to know how much we value and appreciate your feedback!

One recurring theme we heard during the conference call was the importance of collaboration and coordination between our general education and special education teachers, and related services staff. To that end, our general education teachers meet with their special education teacher and/or related services staff at least weekly, and more often than not multiple times per week to review each student's learning plan for the week. Together, they are reviewing IEP goals, objectives and accommodations, prioritizing instruction, and working to balance the workload for students with learning differences. If you find your child is struggling, please communicate with his/her case manager. We are here to help!
